Creeds & Confessions used interchangeably

Creedalism Timothy George (SBC)

Uniform Christian belief imposed through State coercion

Lordship of Christ

Theological standard elevated above the authority of Scripture

Baptists are NOT creedal

Sola Scriptura

Liberty of conscience

Purpose of Confessions (Origins)

- Continuity with faith revealed in Scripture
- Principles for interpreting Scripture
- Distinctiveness from other Protestants Believers' Baptism rather than infant baptism Local Church membership visible, regenerate, baptised
- Distinctiveness from other Baptists

Baptist Unity and Uniformity

Theological priority: Scripture the [a] source of God's revelation to humanity

- Contending for the Truth oppose error. "the faith once for all delivered to the saints" Jude 1:3
 - "The Lord has yet more light and truth to break forth from his Word" (John Robinson 1620)
- Maintaining unity. "endeavouring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace' Eph 4:3
- Practising love. Jesus command "love one another as I have loved you. "In essentials [for salvation] unity, in non-essentials liberty, in all things charity"

Baptist Unity and Uniformity

Defending the truth often led to splits

Within both General and Particulars

- baptism & membership, open/ closed Lord's Supper
- Laying on of hands at baptism; Hymn singing

Particular Baptist Splits

- Double Predestination, superlapsarian / sublapsarian
- Mission Baptist Mission Society 1792 UK, Triennial Convention 1814 USA;
- slavery (formation of Southern Baptist Convention 1845)
- Liberal Theology (SBC Baptist Faith and Message 1925, 1963, 1994) split from BWA 2004, . Cooperative Baptist Fellowship 2003 split from SBC join BWA.

Advocating love and unity sometimes led to mergers

- Formation of Baptist Union of Great Britain (1891) required no Confession of Faith;
 2018 Constitution has only 3 general statements as Basis of Union.
- Formation of Baptist World Alliance (1905) unity with diversity *Principles and Guidelines for intra-Baptist Relationships* 2005

NSW Baptists Unity and Uniformity

1834 Saunders – Bathurst Street Church. Particular Baptist with open membership and open communion

1868 Webb- Baptist Association. Particular Baptist – Scripture the only rule of faith and practice. membership for all Baptist Churches and Baptised persons, no interference with individual churches

1870 Webb / Greenwood – Baptist Union – removes reference to Baptist Churches and Baptised persons. Scripture the only rule of faith and practice. Strict and Particular Baptists 1872 Greenwood – 'statement of faith' in 'Model Trust Deed', only 8 headings.

1919 Baptist Union Incorporation Act incorporates unchanged 1872 'statement of faith' 1979 Revision of Statement of Faith. 13 headings, each heading explained.

2000 Statement of Principle – applies only to ministers.

7 Principles Focus on autonomy of the local church, congregational government, open membership (except for Property Trust matters), counsel from Baptist Churches of NSW/ACT, pastor as servant leader cooperating with giftedness of others

2012 First Constitution approved incorporating 1979 Statement of Beliefs.

2017 Revised Constitution.

Outcomes

Individuals leave for other denominations, occasionally a church leaves with its pastor Sub-groups form and stay within Association of Baptists Churches of NSW & ACT

NSW Baptists Unity and Uniformity

Since 1870 majority of NSW / ACT Baptists have followed the following principles: a minimal evangelical theological statement; autonomy of the local church; maintaining unity by focusing on cooperative evangelism and mission; encompassing diversity of theological opinions.

Tends towards: Unity, Love, Diversity, Inclusion

There has always been alternative views pushing for a minority view; e.g. more detailed theological statements, or greater authority of the Association over the local church Tends towards: Truth, Uniformity, Exclusion

The gathered delegates of the Association meeting in Assembly discern the mind of Christ.
