FACE COVERINGS/MASKS

- Must be carried at all times.
- All individuals aged 12 years and over must wear a face mask upon leaving home when in indoor areas, including in workplaces.
- Only children in years 7 to 12 are required to wear a face mask while in indoor spaces at school.
- A person is not required to wear a face mask if they have a physical or mental health illness or condition, or disability, which makes wearing a face mask detrimental to their condition.
- A person may remove their face mask in an indoor space in the following situations:
 - o when consuming food, drink or medicine.
 - o when communicating with a person who is deaf or hard of hearing and visibility of the mouth is essential for communication.
 - when at work and the nature of the work means that wearing a face mask creates a risk to health and safety.
 - o If asked to remove a face mask to ascertain identity (eg if asked by a police officer).
 - When undertaking vigorous exercise.
 - When performing essential work in an indoor space, but only when:
 - in an office where no other people are present; OR
 - when sitting or standing at a workstation in an office; AND
 - 1.5 metres away from any other person.

As soon as a person is no longer alone or is moving, they must wear a face mask.

- o If they are in the process of getting married in an indoor space.
- o If alone in a vehicle or with other members of the same household only.
- o Because of an emergency.
- o If a person is seated at a table in a restaurant or café.

Note: A face covering means a mask or other covering that fits securely around the face and covers the nose and mouth to provide the wearer with protection against infection. A scarf or bandana is not a face mask.

- Facemasks likely to only be required for high-risk indoor settings only (exemptions apply)
 - Consideration will be given to whether mask wearing may only apply for high risk settings where physical distancing is not possible.
