TBC serving and leading opportunities are open to all who call TBC their spiritual home (defined in our Constitution as *the Fellowship*.)

<u>Membership</u> is open to any of *the Fellowship*. If you are not yet a member, please read more and consider whether this is for you.

Eligibility to be selected to join our team of volunteers is in accordance with our <u>Safe</u> <u>Church Staff and Volunteer procedure</u>. We are required by law to have and to implement our Safe Church policy by law and in order to be covered by insurance and to attain Safe Church status. This obligation is similar to the need to hold a Driver's Licence to be permitted to drive on Australian roads.

Descriptions have been prepared for staff and volunteer roles that include spiritual and other gifts that may be an appropriate for the role. A general volunteer description covers the many tasks that used to be undertaken at church working bees and on other ad hoc instances.

In the past, when we wanted something to be done or to form a team, we published an announcement like the one below.

We can't do this anymore!

We can now only allow people to join a working group like this who are **eligible to be asked**.

The <u>Safe Church and Volunteering</u> tab in our App and on the websites explains what you need to do to get your name included on the list of eligible people.

"We need to clean the glass or repair a wall. We think we will need 5 people who can come on Saturday morning. The job will take 5 people for 4 hours

This is a BIG change for us and we can all have a part of play in achieving eligible status and helping others to do so.

Building our team of volunteers—we're in this together

As you see, from my comments above, this is a challenge for all of us and we want to work together to get us through to where we want to be.

Having said this, it was encouraging to know that, when we completed our *NCLS Church Census*, we identified that the number of people volunteering at the time of the census was equal to about one-third of the number completing surveys. Many of these volunteers have completed or are well on the way to completing all of the requirements.

You will have heard me mention that I have recently been involved in the processes of one of my children becom-



ing eligible to drive on our roads and there are now many steps involved in achieving this. It's not just a matter of mastering the workings of the car and learning the road rules.

And, as many of you know from your own experiences and the experiences of your friends, people learn to drive in different ways and from different people. Not every parent is the best person to teach their child to drive or master all the compe-

tencies now required in the ACT.

Becoming eligible to be asked

Here are some ways that we plan to get us all through the Volunteering Process.

- 1. Complete the process yourself following the <u>instructions and using the forms</u>. Word versions of the documents can be requested by sending an Enquiry through the App or Website of sending an email to tbchurch@internode.on.net.
- 2. Group Process in the Community Room after Sunday service (11:30–1:00) probably in October.
 - Bring your laptop or other device or borrow one of ours, to complete forms with the assistance of the facilitators. We can also have hard copies for those who prefer to write.
 - Watch the Safe Church Training Videos together.
 - Log into the Creating Safe Spaces on-line module and get started so that you can finish. Some people find this process is a bit tricky.

Bring a packed lunch and drinks will be available.



- 3. Work with an individual coach
 - Use the Enquiry Form in the App or on the Website to request a time with an individual coach.:
 - Add your contact details and the best times for you to meet with the coach in your enquiry so that these can be passed on to the coach.

CURRENT COVID SAFETY MEASURES—IN PLACE UNTIL THE EMERGENCY ENDS—CURRENTLY DUE TO END 30 SEPTEMBER

It is very pleasing to see the number of new cases each day is falling. Thank you for doing your part.

Places of worship are required to have a COVID Safety Plan in place and ours can be found here.

The ACT Health Minister has urged us to wear masks whenever in indoor settings as the latest initiative to limit the spread of disease.

The <u>Auditorium</u> layout includes fixed allocation of seating for people who have been attending in-person on a regular basis. For these people there is no longer the need to book for each week's Sunday service. If you can't attend



use the <u>NO THANKS</u> event so that we may seat others in the seats vacated by your non-attendance.

If you are returning to in-person services for the first time, it would be helpful if you RSVP for the Sunday service Event in the App or on the Website but it's also fine if you attend without booking. We can find you a seat on the day.

The COVID Safety team will greet you on the day and help you to your seat.

Our plan encourages COVID Smart behaviours as we provide a sanitising stations, hygiene products and encourage the you to wear a mask where you cannot physically distance.

Handshaking and kissing can spread infection so team members will be not using them as a form of greeting when greeting you at the door.

During the pandemic, the COVID Safety Team and Operations (then named Transition) Team have managed our risks but, with the appointment of Alan, we are now making plans to revert to operating in accordance with WHS and to implement our Safe Church policies.

DISCUSSION FORUM—BAPTIST DISTINCIVES AND DRAFT RECOMMENDAT-INOS FOLLOWING THE SPECIAL ASSEMBLY OF FEBRUARY 2021

On Saturday 3 September 2022 the Baptist Association of NSW & ACT will be holding a movement-wide Forum. This Forum is intended to provide time for more informal discussion of important matters pertaining to the current discernment process around affiliating together in our Association.



Registrations are required, with the option of attending inperson or online via Zoom. The Forum will be open to anyone who is an active member or attendee of a Baptist Church. If you register to attend online via Zoom you will receive a unique link that must not be shared or distributed to others.

It is anticipated the forum will consist of 2 major sections:

- 1. Input, reflection and discussion around matters of Baptist Distinctives identified in the affiliation discussion process so far.
- 2. Session(s) where Assembly Council will present draft recommendations following the Special Assembly in February 2021 and provide time for questions, prayer, reflection, discussion and feedback in a non-formal setting.

SPECIAL ASSEMBLY FEBRUARY 2021-RECAP

Prior to the assembly, we sent an email explaining why our Delegates to the assembly intended to vote





against the motions proposed, as follows:

The TBC Leadership team considers the following points are relevant:

• The proposing churches framed their motions in the context of their concerns about same-sex marriage, possibly

to provide a basis for action in relation to the stated value of honouring marriage. However, the motion provides for a much broader range of criteria for disaffiliation as it is framed in terms of adherence to all doctrines, objects and beliefs.

- Different views on this value or any other value should not be used as the basis to remove ministers from accreditation, nor to withdraw the affiliation of individual churches.
- The Constitution of the Association of Baptist Churches in NSW&ACT already provides for withdrawal of affiliation (Para 17.5).

The main issue for the church Eldership then, and now, is that implementation of the motions where a relatively small margin voted in the affirmative, is the threat to the autonomy of our church and other Baptist Churches currently affiliated with the Association of Baptist Churches in NSW & ACT.

The autonomy of each local is a key Baptist Distinctive and the Distinctives form part of the agenda for the Discussion Forum.

FOOD SERVICES

There is a close link between food and the sharing of the gospel and there are a number of examples in the gospels where Jesus combined teaching with food and several where he and the apostles supplied and served the food and did the clean up.

During the pandemic, food services have been suspended as the sharing of platters of food, serving dishes and utensils spread infection. We have seen, as we returned to in-person services that people are keen to socialise after services without the inducement of food services. However, as we move into the new normal, we plan to begin serving food as follows.

We plan this pattern of after-service events with food and fellowship:

- Term 4 Spring Event on the Ground level—possibly sausage sizzle the Sunday before school starts in October or when the Health Emergency ends. This year we plan to run the Sausage Sizzle when we have the Brigades Parade.
- 2. Pre-Christmas event—picnic at the Adventure Playground, Kambah—first Sunday in December (4th in 2022)
- 3. Term 1 Summer Event on the Ground level— Sunday before school starts in January (29th in 2023)
- 4. Good Friday—Community Room—Morning Tea after the service serving Easter (Hot Cross) Buns
- 5. Term 3—Winter Warmer—Soup and Sandwiches—Community, Board and Seminar Rooms.

This is a very rough plan and subject to change in dates and menu.

FUTURE PLANNING WORKSHOP

A focus group will attend a workshop facilitated by elders Craig Leon and Rob James. They will be look at forward planning measures and will include the *NCLS Profile Summary for Tuggeranong Baptist Church* which is based on the information of 110 of our church family that identified areas that we need to be given attention

The 2021 Australian Community Survey (ACS) that was conducted at the same time as our individual surveys looks **at** the attitudes, views and actions of the Australian community in the areas of spirituality, well-being, Christianity and the church. The <u>webinar</u> What Australians really think about Jesus and the Church today explains the implications of the results in our future planning.

Karl Faase commented the gap between perception and facts distilled by research and, on the analysis of the survey data states

- There's plenty of reason to hope
- There is a positive response towards Christianity from the younger demographic
- There is a positive response to Jesus (less so the church)

Karl also drew attention to Ruth's statement that it's the 50– 64 aged group, today's CEO and influencers (the people holding the microphone), who are also the group who are least involved (attendance, belief, practice and positivity were the measures) and this needs to be taken into account in our deliberations.

FINANCE-REVIEW

The Church's financial year of 30 September 2022 is now only a few weeks away Our offerings for the year to 31 July are \$175,298. The budgeted figure for Offerings to meet our Annual Expenses is \$270,000.

In answering questions at the AGM, the Treasurer mentioned that our offerings have slowed a bit since the beginning of our financial year and the possibility of a loss this year of \$30,000.00. The loss for the year at 31 July is \$25,731. Our expenses in August and September are high as they include a number of quarterly payments and our annual insurance of about \$10,000.

Our expenditure exceeds the amount that we receive in offerings though our offerings have been much the same throughout the pandemic as most people switched to on-line giving.

We have recently authorised our fire protection service to replace some of the Emergency lights which failed to meet the required standard when last tested. This expense of \$6,000.00 was not in our budget for this financial year and the amount of our loss will increase by this amount before the end of the financial year.

In times of crisis, like the pandemic, you spend to survive and build up resources when the crisis passes. We have done better than this, in that we received grants for the Community Room Upgrade and Solar Panel installation as

well as meeting our business-as-usual commitments and upgrades to our lift and fire protection services.

God expects us to give cheerfully and does not expect you to give what you cannot.

We continue to trust God to provide for our financial needs as He has done in the past and to ask for his wisdom as we review our individual and church budget in light of the increases in the cost of living to determine that each of us is giving as He would have you do.

We trust that, with God' help, we can move into a season when our offerings cover our expenses and make provision for unforeseen emergencies. It's time to start building a reserve or sinking fund that we can draw on when future emergencies arise.

THE LAST WORD
