

After the Resurrection—Sunday teaching

While our Lead Pastor, Ian Reid is on leave, our guest preachers have taught on aspects to Resurrection as relates to ur 2024 theme of Going Deeper. Some of the highlights are:

14 April—Phil Waugh echoed the apostle Paul's declaration that the death, burial and resurrection is of first importance and taught how the resurrection transforms how we may live and how we die in faith. He explained how the resurrection gives us meaning as we participate in the Kingdom of God and that we do not share in the fears of those who do not have faith. 1 Cor 15:3-

21 April—**Steve Coster** shared how Jesus connected with Thomas in response to his questions and how the principle of autonomy reflects how the resurrected Jesus appeared and invited the disciples to work out the next steps together in the power of the Holy Spirit. Based on the work of Shannon Hopkins and an article The Church is being Remade, Steve took us through the acronym BLESS using illustrations from this encounter between Thomas and the risen Christ in Jn 20:19-31.

- Back—to not be paralysed by always looking back—we are called to look and move forward
- Lament—to deal with the past. Jesus invited Thomas to touch the points of his pain and deal with them. If we don't grief then grief will overwhelm us.
- Experiment—look for ways to engage and connect with our community and experiment that requires bravery, courage, faith and prayer. The release of the Holy Spirit on everyone was a brave new experiment for God as the Holy Spirit had previously been poured out selectively.
- **S**erve—to give ourselves to show God's love to the world. No longer acting as though their past determines how we will treat you in line with whosever sins you remit, they are remitted.
- **S**urprise—to be open to be surprise and to surprise others to bring blessing and to connect though this may be uncomfortable.

12 May James Ramsay identified the resurrection as the hinge of Christianity 1 Cor 15:13-19 [NIV] quoted in the side bar and introduced us Gary R Habermas' Minimal Facts Argument for the Resurrection distilled from multiple independent sources and agreed by 90+% of scholars:

- 1. Jesus died due to crucifixion.
- 2. Followers believed that they saw the resurrected Jesus.
- 3. Followers proclaimed the resurrection immediately.
- 4. Followers lives were completely transformed.
- 5. Jesus' brother became a believer.
- 6. Paul, the greatest persecutor becomes a believer.

If there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised. And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith. More than that, we are then found to be false witnesses about God. for we have testified about God that he raised Christ from the dead. But he did not raise him if in fact the dead are not raised. For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised either. And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins. Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ are lost. If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied. 1 Cor 15:13-19 [NIV]

Budget


The Treasurer presented a balanced budget for 2024 that depends on an increase in our annual offerings of \$58,086.

Association with other Baptist Churches—Open Baptist

Since 2019 when the question of Affiliation and Same-Sex Marriage has been debated through a number of processes ant at various Assemblies including the Special Assembly I February 2021. To trace the whole saga, refer to the many attachments stored on our website here.. Throughout, we have maintained that the Baptist distinctives of autonomy of the local church, the priesthood of all believers and freedom of conscience have been overridden by a move towards compliance with a centralized model as the basis of association. In relation to the Assembly Council's proposed Process for disaffiliation of churches to be put to Assembly in June 2024, we remain firm in the conviction that:

WE ARE NOT PREPARED TO DIVIDE OUR CHURCH OR DISENFRANCHISE THOSE WHO CALL TUG-GERANONG BAPTIST CHURCH THEIR SPIRITUAL HOME ON THE BASIS OF THEIR BELIEF ABOUT THIS SOCIETAL ISSUE OR THEIR MARITAL STATUS OR STYLE.


There are many other churches and pastors who share our concerns and some have taken action to come together as Open Baptists to prepare for the inevitable disaffiliation of churches and disaccreditation of pastors who value their the Baptist distinctives whether of not they agree with the Association's Position Statement on Marriage which is the current focus.

Churches leaders from New Zealand and Victoria also had concerns about moves in their Associations that threatened the autonomy of the local church joined in the conversation and the Open Baptists emerged as a group/network of Baptists and Baptist churches across Australia and beyond, committed to acknowledging Jesus Christ as the head of the church, the priesthood of all believers, freedom of conscience and the autonomy of the local church. We partner together, aware of our differences, in mutual support and mission to see the good news of Jesus made known.

Many submissions have been made to the Association of Baptist Churches of NSW & ACT urging that a single issue not bring division while, at the same time, preparations for continuation of the churches if that division does occurs have been made—a case of preparing for the worst while hoping for the best.

In August 2023, Open Baptist Ltd was registered with the Australian Securities and Investment Commission (ASIC) as a Public Company limited by Guarantee and is registered as a charity with the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission (ACNC).

Our attention is now focused on the outcomes from the Assembly that convenes on 14 and 15 June, several days after lan's return from leave.
