The Impact of faith on Australian Society commissioned by Olive Tree Media

The findings of research in 2021 are an encouragement to us as we begin to plan for the future:

We recently attended the release of report detailing research conducted by McCrindle for Olive Tree Media.

The <u>report</u> is available in our app or on the website and is published with Olive Tree Media's permission. The objectives of the research included:

- Investigate how Christianity has impacted the values of Australians
- Understand Australians' perspectives of Christians and Christianity

The discoveries made may prompt some interesting discussion with your friends.

- Despite Builders being more likely to identify with Christianity than Gen Z, it is the younger generations who attend church (either in church or online) more regularly....This could highlight a decline in cultural Christianity as members of the emerging generations who identify with Christianity may be more likely to live out their faith.
- Australians who were born overseas are more likely to remain committed to the religion they were shaped in from their younger years than those born in Australia.



- Those who are born in Australia re more likely to be cool towards Christianity than those born overseas.
- Australians who are warm/neutral to Christianity are most attracted to the Christian faith by seeing first hand people live out a genuine faith.

All church picnic after the service at the Garratt Street Centre on Sunday 5 December

In the normal course of events, the service on Sunday 5 December would be the final Kids' Church event for the year where we would enjoy a presentation from the children and where they would receive gifts.

The picnic is an Organised Outdoor event, with their lighter restrictions where we can enjoy a time of catching up. The environment is safer for the children than inside our Auditorium.

20 ACT schools have now been identified as exposure locations so it's important that we offer this event out of doors but ask that parents are responsible for their own children. Families with children may prefer to come to the park at 12 noon and not attend the service a Garratt Street Centre before. Sara will deliver children's gifts at the picnic.

It's a **bring your own everything** event . The plan is that each person will bring their own chair, blanket, food and drink and that we will arrange ourselves in groups that are COVID compliant (1.5m between groups and avoiding

shared platters and utensils).

National Church Life survey—online from 16 January to 13 February 2022

ENCOURAGEMENT FROM THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT

Over the period of the pandemic, we have been encouraged by the invitations from David Smith, Member for Bean to submit applications for grants which have been approved.

COMMUNITY ROOM UPGRADE



Blinds have now been fitted in the Community Room and we have taken delivery of some of the kitchen cabinetry and assembly by ourselves is underway (see photograph). Electrical work was completed by *Select Electrical and Solar* who donated materials, a tradesman and his apprentice to supply an additional circuit and reposition some of the existing outlets.

GRANT FOR INSTALLATION OF SOLAR PANELS – SUCCESSFUL

We received advice firstly from the office of the Federal Member for Bean, David Smith and then via email from the Department of Industry, Science, Energy and Re-

sources that we will receive a grant of \$9,000.00 as part of the *Powering Communities Program*.

The last word —Concerns about capturing your private information to meet Safe Church requirements

We find ourselves at a point of time in the history of our nation when, because of the institutionalised abuse of children and other vulnerable people that has occurred in churches, our Federal and State governments have embedded the *10 Child Safe Standards* into legislation. These standards and legislation set out how government expects us to treat citizens and the care we should take when to recruit and screen volunteers.

To meet our legal obligations, all volunteers and staff in the church from tea makers and working bee volunteers to the lead pastor must undergo training and document private and sensitive information that we are required to store securely for a very long time (30years).

The important takeaway in Philippians 3:5-8 is often considered to be that all of the apostle Paul's heritage, education and accomplishments were things that he would throw away so that he might be enriched in the reality of knowing Jesus Christ. However, in the context of the question about why the church (and her people) should provide their credentials, we see that the inclusion of this information inspires confidence in the readers then and now. Paul's scholarship is of great value to the church and we thank God that Paul did not throw away his accomplishments but incorporated them into written instructions to the church that are now part of our New Testament.

So, quite apart from obeying the law, there is value in our documented recruiting and screening policies and practices. It inspires confidence both within the local church and in the public arena.

Answering *Yes* to any of the questions on the <u>Screening Questionnaire</u> does not automatically disqualify you from serving. I cover this in the Induction Videos that I have made and ask that you check these out and, if you still have concerns or want more clarity, to give me a call on this or any other matter.
