

The Church—Unity and Diversity

Nicky Gumble concludes the session on the church, with a declaration of his love for a number of streams of expression of the church in our time. Catholics, Protestants and Pentecostals are mentioned as he declared that there is more that unites than divides us.

Jesus prayed all who believed in him might be one. Throughout the ages, many traditions have arisen to maintain uniformity — of thinking, attitude and action.

Some of us remember the concerns of our Catholic friends when their church services were no longer conducted in Latin. Until then Catholics, as a sign of their unity, worshipped God in the same way and in the same language – even

though Latin has not been the spoken language of any nation for centuries.

A similar example is the resistance to translating the Bible into languages spoken by people. Heroes of the faith have died at the stake so that we now have many versions of the bible and, in our time, in many formats so that we might grow in faith.

Divisions have occurred over both doctrine and traditions of men and many have elevated adherence to their positions as necessary to salvation and fellowship. Practices have included putting non-compliers out of community, splitting the church or leaving themselves. That is, they have seen their position as the one true religion and those with other views as less than.


The "as we are one" part of the verse it seems is easily lost now as it was in the early church. This caused the apostle Paul to provide a very full explanation of the diversity demonstrated in the creation and needed for the church function as the body of Christ, and to be effective in its mission to build God's Kingdom.

With others in the church leadership team, I wish to thank the members for their overwhelming approval of the motion to join Open Baptists which was carried by 86% in favour.

This demonstrates members' willingness to affiliate with others for whom the autonomy of the local church is of vital importance and who may for may not hold identical view to ours.

We are united in Christ and consequently are in relationship with the Father and the Holy Spirit and are united in the mission to bring many sons to glory.

9 but we do see Jesus—who for a while was a little lower than the angels—crowned now by God with glory and honor because he suffered death for us. Yes, because of God's great kindness, Jesus tasted death for everyone in all the world. 10 And it was right and proper that God, who made everything for his own glory, should allow Jesus to suffer, for in doing this he was bringing vast multitudes of God's people to heaven; for his suffering made Jesus a perfect Leader, one fit to bring them into their salvation. ¹¹ We who have been made holy by Jesus, now have the same Father he has. THE BUILDING AT WORK

The majority of us are at our weekly gathering on Sunday mornings, and may have the impression that the building is fairly idle for the days between Sundays.

One of the main joys of the building is that we are able to have a combination of both dedicated and shared spaces so that we do not require our team of General Volunteers to continually move furniture and reconfigure spaces.

Every day of the week something happens in the building:

Monday: Auditorium and Administration (used by staff throughout the week)

Communities @ Work recently used the Community Room for a series of 4 free sessions on Nutrition and Cooking on a Budget. They may run classes in 2025.

Tuesday: Community Room, Op Shop, Training Space, Board Room are used by Explorers, Elders or Leadership Team meetings, Op Shop and Maggie Moo Music program for toddlers.

The Auditorium is used by the Worship Team.

Wednesday: Community Room, Op Shop and Training Room used by Operations Team for meetings, Op Shop and Maggie Moo. Seminar and Board Rooms used by Canberra Bible College.

Thursday: Op Shop, Community Room for monthly meeting of the National Council of Women. Brigades use: Training room, Kids Space, Seminar Room, Board Room, Level 1 Kitchen, Basement car park.

Friday: Connect through Craft, fortnightly.

Saturday: Community Room used by the CAP Money Course several times each year.

Ground Level spaces are the venues for our fellowship food gatherings.

Presentation Night for Boys' and Girls Brigade 26 November 2024.


Christmas Picnic 1 December 2024 Head off to the Adventure Playground after the Sunday service.

Finance—Facts and Figures



Budget

The Treasurer presented a balanced budget for 2024 that depends on an increase in our annual offerings of \$58,086.

Our budgeted monthly offering is \$20,375

Offerings since the last *Informer* were—July \$12731.00, August \$19289.11, September \$16072.11.

Outgoings for the same period totaled \$76,335.74.

Our bank balance at the 30 September was \$346,819.96 which included the proceeds of sale of Jenke Cct. Funds from the sale have been allocated to the building loan. Term deposits have been set up in October.

Each Baptist church is responsible for meeting its own expenditure. There is no central funding body for any of our expenses.

Our financial year ended on 30 September 2024.
