COVID UPDATE

The ACT has stepped down from public health emergency settings to a more targeted COVID-19 Management Declaration. Places of worship are no longer required to have a COVID Safety Plan.

Consequently, we have removed most signage and other COVID Safety paraphernalia. We have left handsanitising, disinfectant wipes and masks in place as COVID and other infectious viruses have not gone away. We are learning to live with them. This includes all of us accepting responsibility for our own health and that of others in our church community.

PHYSICAL GREETINGS

Greeting team members will not include physical contact as they meet you at the entry of the Auditorium each Sunday as this may spread any viruses throughout the congregation. The importance of this measure is increased by the removal of national mandatory isolation rules which may flow on to the ACT rules.

We ask that you not take offence if anyone prefers not to share a physical greeting with you and remember that they may be protecting you from becoming ill—an act of love, not an act of rejection.



Reputations—Christians and the Church

Olive Tree Media commissioned a survey conducted by McCrindle which offered 10 negative and 10 positive choices as answers to the question How would you describe the Christians you know? These are the results:

How would you describe the Christians you know? Please select all that apply.



On the other hand, the media continues to paint a negative picture of the Church as a whole. The findings of the *Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse* led to the establishment of national standards that are the foundations of the legislative requirements for our volunteers.

As we work together, through compliance with our volunteering processes, to achieve Safe Church status, <u>we build</u> the reputation of the Church.

At the recent Mini-Conference for Women, we looked at these two aspects:

- 1. We can give people in community the chance to know a Christian by joining in the good works that they are doing
- 2. We can change the reputation that people have of the Church by achieving Safe Church status which involves a little work on our part to comply with the standards required.

We invite you all to meet the requirements for staff and volunteers at Tuggeranong Baptist Church and offer the Group Process meeting on 30 October 2022 to help with this.

GATHERING AND ORDINARY ASSEMBLY 12 NOVEMBER 2022

Several of the Leadership Team were able to join the Association of Baptist Churches in NSW&ACT Discussion Forum on Saturday 3 September 2022. The Zoom sessions included presentations by individuals and a panel and we each attended different breakout groups to consider various aspects of being Baptist and the Draft Recommendations.

The Assembly Council has foreshadowed a motion to the 12 November 2022 Assembly that will, among other things, provide that churches will be expelled from the Association if they indicate that they do not (i) affirm that marriage is a covenant relationship ordained by God as a lifelong faithful union of one man and one woman and (ii) support the 1979 statement of beliefs. Similarly, accredited ministers who do not affirm that marriage is a covenant relationship ordained by God as a lifelong faithful union of one man and one woman or who change their views on the 1979 statement of beliefs will be disaccredited

The Leadership team will consider our position again as we are leading up to the Ordinary Assembly and when the motions, which we expect will be much like the draft motions discussed at the forum, are published.

This week, we have received this message from a group of concerned accredited pastors currently affiliated with the Association of Baptist Churches of NSW & ACT. The letter may be accessed here.

The views expressed are grouped under these headings. That:

- These motions will divide and damage our Association.
- These motions impact our mission now and into the future.
- These motions hurt people in our churches.
- These motions will cause conflict in our churches.
- These motions make no effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.

The contribution of <u>Ps Belinda Groves of Canberra Baptist Church</u> very closing aligns to the church Eldership's previously expressed views:

I met a colleague, who – until recently – had worked in other denominations, and he said to me, "It's great to be a Baptist again – part of such a broad church." And – until recently – I would have agreed! Conversative Evangelicals, Charismatics, Progressives – each of these expressions of Baptist faith have enriched mine. But these motions rob us of that breadth. They ignore the gift of our Baptist heritage that equips us to have difficult conversations, as we have in the past, and remain in fellowship. They disdain our unique Baptist witness that unity can exist without uniformity; that what ultimately unites us is faith in and commitment to the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

A call of the following action concludes the message of concern:

Unless Assembly Council brings a new motion to the 12 November Assembly, the only way to prevent the harm these motions will do to our Association, our churches, and our witness is to vote against them. If any of the views shared in this letter have raised your concern about Assembly making a decision of this magnitude, we urge you to send a full number of delegates to Assembly and to vote against it, because once the process is in place it will be almost impossible to revoke.

The document's **Appendix** summarises historical markers related to the issues and provides examples of how individuals and churches have been allowed to hold diverse positions without being expelled from the Association.

The main issue for the church Eldership then, and now, is that implementation of the motions where a relatively small margin voted in the affirmative, is the threat to the autonomy of our church and other Baptist Churches currently affiliated with the Association of Baptist Churches in NSW & ACT.

FAITH RUNS DEEP—KARL FAASE INTERVIEWS OTHERS—19 OCTOBER TO 9 NOVEMBER

Four sessions have now been discussed on Tuesday mornings and Wednesday evenings and participants have



agreed that they did not know or understand the various aspects of faith running deep in our history. Some of these are:

Transportation to Australia resulted from an act of mercy by magistrates in England who valued offences at one penny less than £2 that attracted a mandatory death penalty; that early pastors appointed to the settlement understood their work as fulfilling the command to take the gospel to the ends of the earth; that the emancipation of convicts who

completed their sentence is the origin of the *fair go* that is one of our nation's core values; that the depths of faith in creator and care and affinity with the creation was a core value of First Nations Australians long before colonisation; and that, according to the latest census, the percentage of First Nations Australians who identify themselves as Christians is 58% while the National figure is 52%.
