A **Future Directions** group will be meeting over the summer to discern where we are and more importantly where we God is leading and to strategize and to plan.


My sincere thanks to you all for your faithfulness and fruitfulness. It is a major source of my thanksgiving to God for you all.

Explorers - Reflection



During the past 2 years, the Explorers' Group have met most Tuesday mornings in the Community Room at the Garratt St Centre.

The concept of Explorers is to do just that...explore the bible, how we react to it, how we live it, how we share it.

While I was exploring other parts of the world during my leave, the Explorers revisited the great doctrines of the church and looked at the origins of Christian denominations to understand that, throughout the ages and today, scripture is viewed through different lenses – some of these passed down from generation to generation. The Explorers came to see that it is very important to seek out and know the context of what we read in our bibles.

We take inspiration from the example of the Bereans:



The Bereans lived in the Greek city of Berea, also called Beroea, in the time of the Apostle Paul, about AD 50. These people, mentioned in Acts 17, are best known for searching and studying the Bible for themselves and not merely accepting what they were taught.

Acts 17:11 NIV, records that the people in Berea "received the message with great eagerness and examined the Scriptures every day to see if what Paul said was true." This, he said, made them "of more noble character" than people in other places who just listened but didn't actually study the Bible carefully for themselves.

Some explorers form the core group of about 8 people and others come when they are able or to study a special topic for a specific time.

We generally follow the church teaching program and a range of people come to some or all the sessions.

My thanks to all who have attended and helped in the exploration of God's word.

CAP Money Course Reflections



Our aims:

- 1. To equip people from our community with some financial tools to enable them to be confident in managing their own finances.
- 2. To provide this as concerned Christians as a free service to our Canberra community.

Promotion

We promoted three courses in March, July and November across Canberra through City News, Canberra Weekly, 1 WayFM, TBC advertising, CDNet (to 2,500 community workers), 7 Facebook Community pages. The most effective advertising has been through the CDNet community word of mouth referrals e.g., Smith Family, Vinnies, Counselling services and many other services.

Coaches

Our coaches included Noel Sewell, Jonathan Boland, Kerrie Whitton and Robert Ardill.

Each course was spread over two Saturday mornings with two coaches presenting each week.

Delegates Attending

Since 2015 TBC CAP Money has assisted around 200 people. We advertised extensively in 2024 and our numbers averaged only four delegates at each course.

This was in a climate of increasing poverty and financial stress in our community. Over 57% of Australians feel financially insecure. Among those aged 18 to 44, the number has increased to 60 percent. The lower CAP course numbers could also indicate a reluctance of people to agree that they might need some assistance in managing their own finances.

But we consider that assisting one person is an important contribution in their life, as Jesus considered each person important. The churches that seem to have a more personal input into people's lives have a wide and positive social interaction in the community. Our Op Shop is one avenue for this. Personal interaction through our COG food vouchers is another avenue. Some churches are now offering Food Banks.

Evaluations received

99% of participants were happy with the **course content** and the **presentation** by the coaches and the **financial tools** introduced to the delegates and the **follow-up** provided after the course.

"I feel like I have a place to start and feel less overwhelmed"

"As a couple we were not working together on finances. After the course we are working together – for savings goals and avoiding impulse buying"

"My budget was all in my head and getting fuzzy. It was helpful to have a definite budget"

Future

TBC CAP Money is moving to an exciting Money Mentor model in addition to the Money Management Course model. TBC will continue to offer the course as a way to attract people to the Money Mentor Model.

As trained Money Mentors, our aim will be to 'walk alongside' people and assist personally. Some of us have started assisting people personally both within the church structure and casually within the community.

As this would be what Jesus would do, as Mentors we need to step out into our community and become more involved in people's lives. We will be doing this as a Safe Church.

In 2024 we have been able to use revenue from Garratt St Op-Shop and the sacrificial extra giving of TBCers to fund this important ministry. We distribute the vouchers primarily to single parent families and are very careful to protect those receiving from embarrassment and additional pain.

\$20,000 was distributed through the Community of Givers program in the 2024 financial

The Garratt St Centre Op Shop Reflections



2024 Started off with a steady flow of volunteers and customers. As the year went on, word got around about the Op Shop and we have seen an increase in the number of new customers.

There has been a decline in the number of volunteers over the year but a significant increase in the number of customers. The community has really rallied around us with

many donations coming in but also many going out for the year.

We recognized that many are struggling financially so we have run many *Specials* throughout the year when we lowered our prices to help people in the community to get affordable clothing.

From time to time, we have an excess of stock or have items that are not being purchased by our clients. We pass these to other charitable organization as we see them as partners with us in helping others that need them. We also refer our clients to other organisations who are qualified and equipped to help them such food pantries and appropriate crisis programs.

Despite the facts that we ran these specials campaigns with drastically reduced prices, introduced a mid-winter break in trading, and had to a couple of COVID closures, profit for the year has increased on the previous year:

2023 financial year \$14, 668 2024 financial year \$17,744

I would like to thank everyone who has helped along the way. A big thank you to the volunteers and for the support from the church.

I would also invite you to consider volunteering next year. We would like to open the shop on Saturdays and this presents a volunteer opportunity for people who are not available during the weekdays.

Church administration - Reflections



Effective and efficient church administration has a significant impact on church life. Indeed facilitation (or administration) is listed as a spiritual gift in Romans 12. Whether a church is small, medium, or large the church is expected to comply with certain legislation in the conduct of its business.

The work of administration is continuous as each year cycles by. However, in 2024 we closed the chapter of the fire that destroyed our building at Jenke Cct when the land finally sold. The journey was long and the church has been blessed over the years that it took, with patient and persistent effort from the people who brought this to pass, in the Lord's time.

Implementation of the members' decision to join the Open Baptists marked another significant milestone in the church's history as this shows our willingness to associate with other Baptists who are united in the major doctrines of the faith, value the principle of autonomy of each local church and respect diversity of expression.

Implementation of a process to disassociate some churches and disaffiliate some pastors from the Association of Baptist Churches in NSW&ACT began in 2024 and marked the end of years of effort expended by our leadership and many others throughout the movement. The process diminishes the autonomy of local churches and is at odds with our Constitution. However, we remain a member church of the Association as we do wish to continue in fellowship with others who may or may not, think differently from us.

Compliance with the many laws and standards is a scripturally based principle so those in leadership of all of our ministries play a part in the administration of the church. In 2024 leaders conducted interviews with our volunteers including those who had been in roles for many years. This brings us into alignment with our Procedure for Staff and Volunteers.

The ACT Associations Incorporation Act 1991 requires that we keep a current Members' Register. The 2024 changes to the register were:

In addition, it is important that our members' and mailing lists are current as they define the extent and boundaries of our pastoral care responsibilities.

Communications - Reflections



Communication is not limited to published materials but is about connections between all the parts and each part playing its role.

Our App and Website are our major tools for dissemination of published materials and provide detailed information about how we do things, when we are doing them and

who to contact.

The functionality of the App allows us to publish content and send Notifications to the general public or to specific groups. This means that we are able to limit the receivers of information especially when it concerns only those in that group.

Communication depends on the sender or the message and the receiver.

We urge all who call Tuggeranong Baptist Church their spiritual home and who own a mobile phone, to create their profile (set up an account) and remain logged into the App so that messages are received as soon as they are published rather than expecting you to be checking your email or opening the App.

Updates and improvements to the software are constantly being made and a new capability to send SMS messages has been included. This feature will be of benefit to us if we are assured that all who want to receive messages from us have created an account in the App.

The content of the App is checked and updated weekly. The church calendar for 2025 is available in the Events section so you can download them into your personal calendars now. This helps you will be able to organize your other activities around these events when it is feasible.

Anyone who can write use a mobile phone to send a message has the skill necessary to use the Prayer Request function in the App and is welcome to do so. Requests are checked each day and circulated to the prayer team. Daily verses and prayers are published each day and the About section has a variety of content.

Our You Tube channel reaches local and country areas in Australia and content is also viewed in overseas countries thus extending our outreach. We have 77 subscribers and 80-100 views on a regular basis. It is reasonab le to suppose that some of these views are from groups of people as well as individuals.

Operations team members wearing teal jackets on Sunday mornings are can provide information or introduce yu to the person who can answer any of your questions.

We also continue to use our mailing list, notice boards and our Sunday announcement slot to communicate events that are coming up and we hold regular Church information meetings as well as our Annual General Meeting where our audited accounts are presented.

Extract from the Constitution of Tuggeranong Baptist Church Incorporated

7) ELDERSHIP

The Elders will be appointed from the membership and shall possess appropriate spiritual qualifications and visionary leadership to enable the strategic direction of the church.

- a) Roles of the Eldership
 - i) Exercise leadership and discipline.
 - ii) Oversee the Ministry and Teaching programs.
 - iii) Take responsibility for the vision and its strategic implementation.
 - iv) Delegate responsibilities for ministries within the Fellowship.
- b) Appointments to the Eldership
 - New Elders shall be appointed by unanimous decision of the existing. Eldership as the need arises. All Elders must be chosen and accepted on the basis of the Scriptural qualifications laid down in 1 Timothy 3 and Titus 1:5-9 and must have been Members for sufficient time to have demonstrated their gifts and character.
 - ii) Before appointment, the name of a proposed new Elder shall be submitted to the Fellowship for affirmation. Prospective appointments will be announced for 2 consecutive Sundays with the Fellowship being invited to bring any concern to the Eldership regarding the proposed appointment.

⁵ The reason I left you in Crete was that you might put in order what was left unfinished and appoint elders in every town, as I directed you. ⁶ An elder must be blameless, faithful to his wife, a man whose children believe and are not open to the charge of being wild and disobedient. ⁷ Since an overseer manages God's household, he must be blameless—not overbearing, not quick-tempered, not given to drunkenness, not violent, not pursuing dishonest gain. ⁸ Rather, he must be hospitable, one who loves what is good, who is self-controlled, upright, holy

and disciplined. ⁹ He must hold firmly to the trustworthy message as it has been taught, so that he can encourage others by sound doctrine and refute those who oppose it.

Safe Church Team Reflection



This year, the team continued to work towards to goal of achieving Safe Church Health Check certification through the Association of Baptist Churches in NSW&ACT.

Our revised Safe Church Policy and Procedures were endorsed by the Eldership in June The incorporate changes in legislation and are adapted from the set of model documents provided by the Association. As a consequence, many of our volunteers were entitled to a year's extension of their *Creating Safe Spaces Workshop* certification until June 2025.

Implementation of our *Procedure for Staff and Volunteers* has continued throughout the year and Ministry team leaders have been conducting interviews with team members to meet recruitment requirements. Some team, members reported that this proved to be valuable as they found out more about the capabilities of their team members and learned better ways to lead them.

There has been a steady flow of documentation to enable us to maintain records which we are required to store for many years. The documents provide evidence of our duty of care in the event of future claims. We expect to have a full snapshot of our current volunteer workforce early in 2025. The screening process for current volunteers is complete.

Keeping up to date with legislation continues to be a challenge and the most recent change was on 1 August 2024, when all providers of services to and for children and young people <u>must</u> commence implementation of the ACT Child Safe Standards Scheme (the Scheme).

The ACT Children and Young People Commissioner (CYPC) will support implementation of the Scheme by working with organisations and sectors to build their capability in promoting and protecting the rights, safety, and wellbeing of children and young people. A key indicator of success will be that children, young people, and their families can see how services are implementing the Standards to make organisations safer for them.

There is more work to do before we can apply for the Safe Church Health Check and we thank volunteers and the team leaders working on this. A successful outcome from health check will go a long way to meet these and other legal requirements and protect us from prosecution in the future.

We thank our volunteers for their work and for contributing to making our church a safe environment for all who see Tuggeranong Baptist Church as their spiritual home now and who seek to find, to love and to serve the Lord now and into the future.

Risk Management -WHS Reflection



Several years ago, *Baptist Insurance Services* advised that meeting the requirements of the Safe Church Health Check from the Association of Baptist Churches in the ACT&NSW satisfies requirements for continued insurance cover for churches' activities.

Workplace Health and Safety feature in the Creating Safe Spaces Workshop training that

is required for all of our volunteers.

The role of WHS Co-ordinator is defined in the Safe Church templates provided by the Association and our WHS Co-ordinator Alan Mitchell, fills a key position in the Safe Church team, WHS Team and the Operations team.

This year James Tod and Brenda White were recruited to the team and undertook the WHS training offered by Baptist Insurance services. Their role is to assist in inspection of the facilities from time to time to make sure that we mitigate as many risks as possible.

A major risk that was identified was safety in our car park and underground basement and the work that was subsequently completed to mitigate the risk of collisions and injury was to introduce speed limits, erect mirrors and add warning strips to the door of the basement car park. We also added reflective strips to define the main gate as people attending evening events had difficulty in seeing were the gateway was (and whether it was open).

Safety lighting is a matter that will receive attention in the near future as this will impact ministries in the autumn.

Baptist Insurance Services have recently updated their training package and this training will be undertaken by the church leadership. Writing of our own WHS Manual, as a reference for Ministry Team leaders, has commenced and instructions for the safe use of equipment used by volunteers is published on App and Website.

Baptist Insurance also provide checklists for many church activities and these are useful when ministries are preparing their Risk Assessments.

Risk Assessments have been submitted by various ministries and we anticipate continuous improvement in this area as people become more familiar with the process. An excellent risk assessment was provided by GB when an off-site gardening activity was planned.

We have become more familiar with the types of records Worksafe ACT expect to examine in the event of a complaint being lodged with them and will be testing the measures we have in place against their criteria in the near future.

Alan and other members of the Operations Team and experienced in the management of risk and are available to educate and to help ministry team leaders or those proposing a new ministry to complete their Risk Assessment.


